# **Future City Teams Prepare for Competition**

This year's JPMS Future City teams are hard at work preparing for the State of Minnesota Future City Competition on Saturday, January 20. Teams have completed their SimCity Virtual City as well as their Research Essay around this year's theme of the Age Friendly City. Next steps include building the 3-D Scale Model from recycled materials and preparing a 5-7 minute presentation that pulls all aspects of the project together. At competition, the model and presentations compete in the morning rounds to decide who advances to the Top 5 Final Round. The winning team then represents Minnesota at the National Competition in Washington, D.C.! During the last two years JPMS has been part of the competition. A number of Justice Page Middle School families are struggling to meet basic needs. Page's social workers are collecting donated items to help our students and families.

**Gift cards**: Gift cards help struggling families with the holidays and beyond. We would love to have gift cards on hand to distribute where help is most needed. In particular, gift cards from the following stores would be most useful: SuperAmerica, Cub, Walmart, Target, and the Braid Factory. We're especially in need of gas cards (e.g. SuperAmerica), but any cards in any amount are welcome!



**Clothing, gift items, and school supplies**: Especially at this time of year, we would love donations of LEGO Star Wars items, men's small winter coats, men's medium winter coats, size 8.5 men's tennis shoes, size 11.5 men's tennis shoes, 3-ringed zippered binders, and spiral notebooks.

<u>Food Pantry</u>: Our Food Pantry provides food-insecure students and their families with vital nutrition in a stigma-free environment. We provide access to food for students and their families both during the day and after the school day has ended. We're collecting non-perishable food items, like chunky soups, ramen noodles, and canned fruit. (Note that for storage reasons, non-canned items can only be accepted in small boxes—for example, we cannot take full boxes of breakfast cereal!)

If you have items to donate to our families, please drop them off in the bins in the main office.

# **Art and Artifacts from the Diane and Alan Page Collection**

School namesake, football Hall of Famer, and former Minnesota Supreme Court Justice Alan Page, along with Diane Sims Page, Executive Director of the Page Education Foundation, will publicly present TESTIFY, a preview of their collection of Americana. The wide-ranging exhibit will feature art and artifacts from pivotal eras in American history while also providing a platform for visitors to share their thoughts, feelings, and personal experiences.

The exhibit will be open January 8 through February 6, in Cargill Hall at the Minneapolis Central Library, 300 Nicollet Mall, Minneapolis.

Inspired by the recent resurgence of racial tension in our country, TESTIFY gives context and definition to the conversation, serving as a reminder of the history that brings us to today.
