Listed below are 18 presidents. Following that is a list of professions and pastimes.

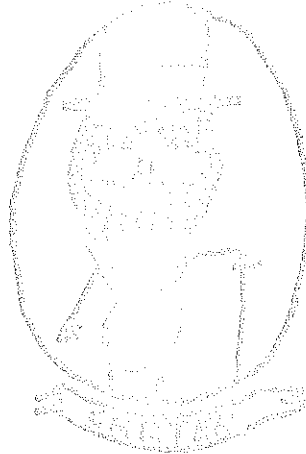
