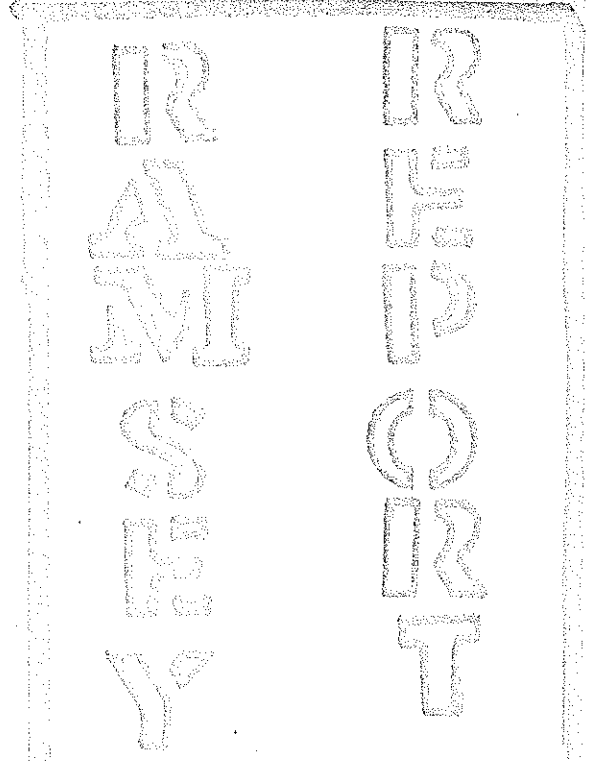
New things are going on with the Student Council.

And last is the "50's" day when you dress up as our forefathers did in the 50's.

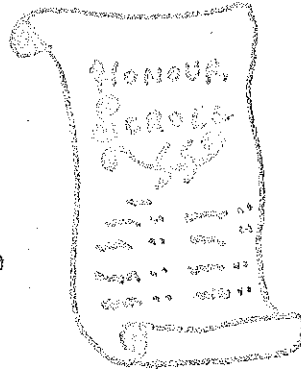

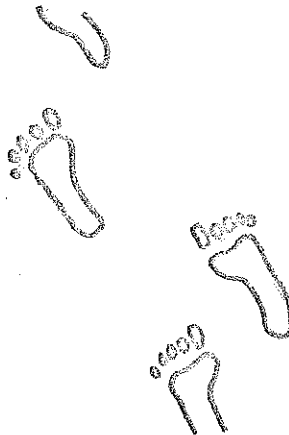
LIMERICK

Between two clocks, one of which is broken, and doesn't run at all, while the other loses one second every 24 hours, which is more accurate, and why?

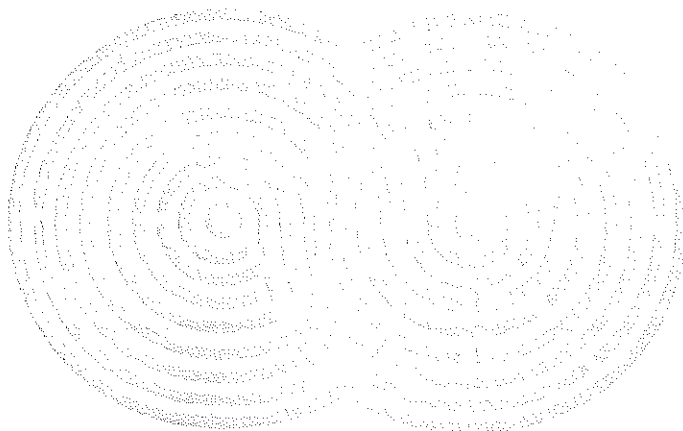
### PUZZLE 2
